



Instructions for Conference Participants

Conference Presentations

As has become traditional for Canadian IUS conferences, individual authors are asked to present their own papers (15 – 20 minute presentations) and the panel chair is asked to keep time, provide some brief integrative remarks (if desired), and moderate the Q&A at the end of the panel session, rather than following the “discussant” model (where the discussant presents a summary of the arguments made by the various authors, along with some integrating comments). Powerpoint will be available, and participants are requested to bring their presentations on a memory key for easy uploading.

Each panel will last 90 minutes. Authors are asked to respect their colleagues and stay within the 15-20 minute maximum timeframe for presentations. In order for the conference to proceed smoothly, all chairs are also asked to ensure that panel sessions start and finish on time.

Conference Papers

We encourage all presenting authors to include their work on the conference CD. Papers included on the CD will not be vetted, and format (e. g., APA, MLA) is entirely at the discretion of the paper author(s). We do ask that authors submit their work for inclusion in EITHER MS Word (2003 version preferred), or as a .pdf file. Further, authors are requested to keep their submitted papers to under 30 pages in length if at all possible. Powerpoint presentations, or short handouts may be included (in lieu of, or in addition to, a full academic paper) if that is the presenting author(s)' preference.

Papers to be included on the conference CD must be received **NO LATER THAN 10 OCTOBER 2016**. This is a firm deadline, and will not be extended.

Franklin Pinch Award for Best Graduate Student Paper

In keeping with the tradition of IUS Canada conferences, in 2012 we will again be awarding the Franklin Pinch award for the best graduate student paper of the conference. In order for the papers to be evaluated, complete conference papers (max. 20 pages) must be submitted to the programme committee chair (Dr. Sarah Hill; sarah.hill@rmc.ca) **NO LATER THAN 10 October 2016**. Papers received after this date will be ineligible for consideration. The award winner will be announced at the conference banquet, and the winner will be provided with an opportunity to speak briefly (5-10 mins) to the full complement of conference delegates about their research.
